Vladimír Richter: I hope the EYOWF 2011 will earn A+



Vladimír Richter has become the new Chairman of the EYOWF 2011 Public Benefit Corporation Administrative Board, which presides the preparations for the 10th European Youth Olympic Winter Festival in the Liberec Region His interests include family, sport, culture and his life credo is "Instead of talking about changes, it is better to take an active part in them."

To be honest, I partially expected to be elected. I have been a member of the Administrative Board from the beginning and I know the entire project, which had been very well led by my predecessor Petr Doležal up until his passing. My family was not particularly excited about my new position because it means I will have even less time for them.

Tell us about your attitude to sport?

Despite my somewhat pronounced physical dimensions, I have to say that I am keen on sports. Before our children were born, my wife Martina and I used to take part in dance competitions. Today, I enjoy cycling, we take pleasure in wandering through the beautiful countryside of the Krkonoše Mountains, but my greatest sporting love is baseball.

This is not a typical hobby for Czech people. Why did you choose this discipline?

I enjoy team sports and I think of myself as a team player. Baseball is not only fun, but provides me with a highly efficient form of relaxation. You do not have to possess the lean figure of a runner or a heap of muscles as in shot put. It is not about acceleration, dynamics or power, it is about mental strategy. Ernest Hemingway once said it is the world's fastest chess. And I would like to make mention of the fact that I currently work as an umpire in the top league and in the Czech-Moravian league.

What is the current state of the preparations of the EYOWF 2011?

We have seven months left until the Festival starts which means the preparations are now entering the final stage. Based on the current state of affairs in all the departments, I believe that we will provide the public with a quality Festival and the smooth organization of the events. The Organising Committee, which has been working very hard thus far, is at present finalising the individual tasks in the system.

What do you see as the main asset of the

The Liberec Region is considered a sporting region because it offers excellent conditions mainly for winter disciplines. A number of top sporting events take place here, especially in the area of skiing. There are modern, recently built venues, which the Festival will help to highlight and this will have a positive effect on the entire tourist industry in the Region. From here Euro-sport 2 channel will broadcast coverage throughout Europe. Personally, what I see as the biggest asset of EYOWF is that it will pose a milestone in the development of youth sport not only in the Czech Republic, but in Europe as well.

The festival opening will be attended by Jacques Rogge the President of the IOC. What would you like him to remember from the Liberec Region?

Undoubtedly a positive feeling that the Liberec Region and our team were able to organise a top international sporting event that earned only the best marks from the sporting, organisational and social point of view. That means only A+...

How would you advertise the event to the spectators in order to attract them to the seats in the venues?

Where else will they see incredible talent, future stars of world sport? Many of them will soon appear among the senior athletes at the Winter Olympic Games 2014 in Sochi. And they will be able to say: I saw them with my own eyes racing as young athletes.

Downhill legend become Director

who has ranked among the elite ten in World Cup races sixteen times and who started twice at the Olympic Games, finishing fourth in the combination at Lake Placid, has been the Mayor of Špindlerův Mlýn. Aleš Krýzl, the father of alpine skier Kryštof Krýzl, who won two medals at the EYOWF 2003 and who is a current Czech national athlete, is the Manager of Alpine Skiing at the EYOWF 2011.

Who are the Patrons of EYOWF 2011?



All eight sport disciplines of the EYOWF 2011 Programme have Patrons, elite Czech athletes. They will present the disciplines to the public. Here are sporting profiles of four of them:



Lukáš Bauer (32 years of age, Cross Country Skiing) - The most successful Czech skier having already started at four Olympic Games. His best result was the Silver medal from the 15 km race in Turin, 2006. He is a nine-time winner of World Cup races, in the 2007/2008 season he dominated the rankings. In 2007/2008 and 2009/2010, he won the Tour de Ski rankings.



Pavel Churavý (33 years of age, Nordic Combined) - He has taken part in three Olympic Games. His best achievement was a 5^{th} place finish from the individual race at Vancouver 2010. He is a regular participant in the World Championship, in 2001 he came in 7^{th} place in the team race. He managed to defend the same place in this year's World Cup rankings.



Veronika Vítková (21 years of age, Biathlon) – This Czech biathlon star shone in the junior categories. She won one gold and two silver medals at the Junior World Championships in 2008 and 2009, as well as two silver and a bronze medals at the European Junior Championship in 2008. In the senior category, she won 5th place at the 2009 World Championship. She has taken part in the Olympic Games once.



Roman Koudelka (21 years of age, Ski Jumping) - He is the gold medal winner from the Junior World Championship in 2007. In the 2006/2007 season, he won $3^{\rm rd}$ and $4^{\rm th}$ place in Grand Prix races, in 2008 he finished fourth at the Four Hill Tour in Garmisch-Partenkirchen. Canadian Vancouver was his Olympic début.
