Dear delegates of the EOC General Assembly,

INTERVIEW

Kateřina Nyčová, Executive Director of the EYOWF 2011 Organising Committee, knows very well that by the time of the Belgrade EOC General Assembly, there are only 78 days left before the Festival.



In the last week, the EYOWF 2011 Organising Committee in the Liberec Region underwent the most thorough vetting of their preparations so far. In Liberec, one after another, there were connected meetings of the EOC Coordination Commission for EYOWF 2011, technical delegates of all eight disciplines and most importantly the Chefs de Mission meeting.

For the organisers, what were the results of this diplomatic attack?

I can proudly say that the results are overall positive. The venues, Olympic Village, all infrastructures and each department of the Organising Committee were subjected to careful and detailed inspections in real environment. For this reason, it is very good news for us that the meeting participants were satisfied with the quality of the organisation and showed great respect for what we are doing. Of course, we have taken into consideration the comments and recommendations. But EYOWF 2011 may begin!

In what ways will the Festival in the Liberec Region be different from the previous events?

We would like the Festival to be more communal, sociable and compact. Winter Festivals are typical for their fragmentation and delegations scattered over many hotels. What we have here, is one Olympic Village and the same conditions for everybody. I believe this will have a positive effect on the overall atmosphere of the competition. Apart from excellent organisation of the sporting part, we will also focus on spare time activities and entertainment for the participants.

Are you ready to meet the expectations of the athletes, guests and visitors?

We will do our best, which is for sure. We have very good conditions and the team is highly motivated, which is – in my opinion – crucial. Our aim is that everybody leaves the Liberec Region happy and will not forget the week spent with us and will gladly return to the Czech Republic in future.

Festival, as you do (not) know it

... The EYOWF in the Liberec Region will take place from the 12th to 19th February 2011 in three towns of the region – Liberec, Jablonec nad Nisou, Kořenov – Rejdic – and in seven sport venues.

... There are eight traditional winter disciplines on the programme: **Alpine Skiing, Biathlon, Cross Country Skiing, Figure Skating, Ice Hockey, Nordic Combined, Ski Jumping and Snowboarding.**

... Representatives of 46 European countries will take part in the EYOWF 2011. From the EOC member states, only athletes from Azerbaijan, Malta and Portugal will be missing.

... There are 500 volunteers of the so-called EYOWF Team taking part in the organisation, eight of them from abroad.

... The Eurosport 2 channel will broadcast 10 hours of coverage from the Festival. These will include **Ice Hockey, Ski Jumping and Cross Country sprint.**

... The 2011 Festival will also have its official song. It is called „Hey you“ and with English lyrics it is performed by the Czech band Eddie Stoilow.

... All participants will be informed regularly about the daily course of the Festival and about other interesting issues by special **Czech – English daily news.**

... The special accompanying fun and knowledge programme vyCOOL se! for elementary and secondary schools of the Liberec Region has been attended by some six thousand participants.



All disciplines of the EYOWF Festivals promise outstanding sports experiences

Liberec supports Brno



Brno, a city of 400 000 inhabitants, which lies in the south of the Czech Republic in the South Moravian Region, candidates for the second time to host the summer version EYOF 2015. In 2008, in Istanbul, Brno lost to Utrecht by a one single vote. Here are the reasons why it should succeed this time:

• **City devoted to sport:** Several elite Czech athletes come from Brno. Football, ice hockey, cycling, basketball, volleyball, tennis, athletics, swimming, figure skating and other sport disciplines are played on excellent level in Brno.

• **Experienced and reliable organiser:** Top international events are regularly held there, e.g. Women's Basketball World Championship, motorcycling Grand Prix, junior European Championship in track cycling, handball, athletic teams, etc.

• **Excellent sport venues:** New and modern stadiums, roofed hall and indoor swimming pools – athletes from Brno, who will take part

in the EYOF disciplines, also start in Czech top league and European cups.

• **Festival of short distances:** All venues, hotels and future Olympic Village in the university campus are only short distance from each other. There will be no long transfers and time losses.

• **High-quality infrastructure:** There are plenty high-quality accommodation capacities in the city, well functioning tram and bus links, many interesting cultural and social events and outstanding gastronomic facilities.

• **Ideal geographic position:** The Czech Republic lies in the heart of Europe, easily accessible. Brno has its own airport.

• **Economic support of the Region:** The South Moravian Region, of which Brno is the capital, guarantees direct economic and organisational support of the EYOF 2015.

• **Transfer of knowledge:** EYOWF 2011 Organising Committee will provide experiences from preparations of this event as well as close cooperation with Brno.

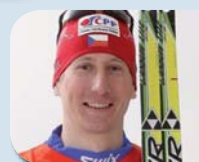
VIP guests feather-bedded
